

85 households (out of 308 homes) in Candlelight Plaza have paid 2019 dues (28%). 75 households have contributed to the Constable program (24%). As an historical reference, 67% of CP households paid Civic Club dues in 2018.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> ANNUAL CPCC EASTER EGG HUNT

The CPCC inaugural Easter Egg Hunt was organized in 2018 in response to a desire for a neighborhood Easter Egg Hunt for families unable to participate in the Plaza Moms Society (PMS) event. Although it is a traditional Easter Egg Hunt several years running, it is for PMS members only. CP residents also had friends and family they wanted to bring along to the hunt. The first CPCC Egg Hunt was put together by volunteers with no budget, and was a great success!

The Second Annual CPCC Easter Egg Hunt is scheduled for Saturday, April 13<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 a.m. in the vacant lot at the corner of Lehman and Golf. The date and time happen to be the same date and time as the 2019 PMS Egg Hunt. As the PMS Egg Hunt is more established (and has a budget), the CPCC Board is concerned the CCCP Hunt and General Meeting may have low attendance. Therefore, three options are under consideration and will be voted on by the Board at a meeting in late March.

Option 1: Keep original plan and hope for good attendance.  
Option 2: Move the event to Durham at a slightly later time, allowing CP residents who are PMS members to participate in both hunts as well as attend the General Meeting.  
Option 3: Move the General Meeting to noon and cancel the CPCC Egg Hunt.

The decision will be posted in the April *CandleGram* as well as on Facebook and NextDoor.

Volunteers needed! Candy-filled plastic eggs needed! (Families that participate in the Hunt are asked to contribute a bag of plastic eggs filled with treats.) Other needs: Pop-up tents, tables, seats, coffee, bagels, donuts, breakfast tacos, fruit, water, juice. Does anyone have access to a bouncy house?

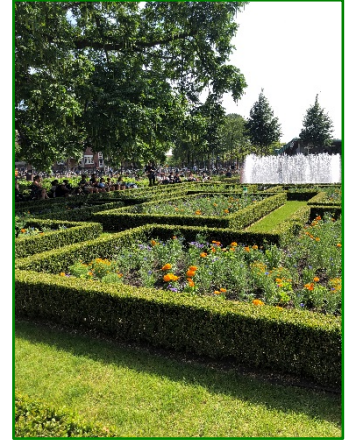
